#### Last term's golden nuggets were:

- 1. Fair Trade ensures fairer terms of trade between farmers and buyers, protect workers' rights, and provide the framework for producers to build thriving farms and organisations.
- A well-balanced meal typically consists of a source of carbohydrates like grains or starches, a source or serving of protein, some fat, 2. and one or more servings of vegetables and fruit.
