Home learning

On a Thursday your child will be assigned a reading book via Oxford Owl and Read Write Inc videos via Seesaw. They will receive a book to read and a book to share to bring home. We will be assigning a weekly Maths home learning activity on Seesaw also on a Thursday. We also have access to Spelling Shed and will be introducing Rollama.



Last term's golden nuggets were:

- 1. Geography is all about people and places.
- 2. A human feature is something that is man made such as a hotel. A physical feature is something natural such as a lake or mountain. Can you think of some different features of Keswick?
- 3. In the First World War people communicated via telegrams, letters and carrier pigeons. Charles went to prison for shooting a homing pigeon. What else do you know about how people communicated in the war?
- 4. Lots of animals helped in the First World War such as dogs and horses. Elephants came from the circus to do the jobs that the horses would usually do on the farms. What else can you remember about how animals helped in the war?
- 5. Harvest Festival is celebrated by Christians to say thank you for food. People belonging to the Jewish faith celebrate Sukkhot at this time. They build shelters called Sukkahs to remember how their people fled from Egypt. They eat meals and sometimes even sleep in them. What else can you say about this?
